Buckden Parish Council News...

Vacancy for Councillor

Unfortunately the Council is losing the services of Peter Emeleus because of the pressure of work and family commitments. His resignation means that there is a vacancy on the Council. The Council can now co-opt a new member and would welcome applications from interested residents. Please contact the Clerk or Chairman if you would like to be considered.

School Zebra Crossing

The Council has been successful in its efforts to obtain a Zebra Crossing between the school and the green on Mill Road. The County Council has formally posted a Notice of Intent to install the crossing. We hope that this will greatly enhance the safety of parents and children at the busy times of the school day.

Allotments

The Parish Council Allotment Advisory Working Group has been working hard to improve the facilities at the allotments. There are now vacant plots. If you are interested please contact the Parish Clerk. If the vacant plots cannot be filled by residents from Buckden, Stirtloe and Diddington they will be offered to the residents of Southoe at a slightly higher rent than that paid by local residents.

Lucks Lane

The Council continues to work with the HDC and the developer's agents to achieve the best results for the proposed development of 180 houses. The views of residents have been taken into account in the Council's comments on the Design Code and we shall continue to make our views clear during the period leading to the Planning Application Detailed Proposals. By the time you read this, the Council will have had a meeting with the developer's agents, Pegasus, and we will report back on this in the January edition.

Budget

Details of the Council's debate on the budget are contained in the minutes of its meeting on 13th November. This is a worrying time for local Councils especially when the County Council is proposing to cut back on the services it provides. This may mean that Town and Parish Councils may need to take on extra responsibilities. In its budget proposal to the District Council, the Parish Council proposed that its contribution to the Council tax bill be increased by 30p a week for a Band D house.

Neighbourhood Plan

At the time of writing, 15th November over 300 responses have been received to the Questionnaire. Our target is to exceed 500. The responses received to date are largely from the over 45s in the village and we would welcome more input from the younger residents. **This is your opportunity to influ-**

ence how the village will develop over the next two decades. Please let us know your views. You can complete the questionnaire by

<u>www.buckdenparishcouncil.org.uk</u> or by contacting the Clerk for a paper copy.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Tuesday 11th December at 7.30p. The meeting includes a 15-minute open forum for residents to ask questions but please apply in writing for a 3- minute slot prior to the meeting. Planning meetings, if required, will be held on Tuesday 27th November and Tuesday 11th December at 7.00pm. FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

The first 'post-austerity' budget has happened. The Chancellor, by nature a fiscal conservative, reluctantly conceded that 'the era of austerity is finally coming to an end.' There were therefore some encouraging announcements of improvements in public expenditure. Substantial extra money for the NHS is welcomed and there were some small improvements for local services. The £420 million for pot-hole filling went down well in the Highways departments across the country, enabling them to respond to the torrent of demands placed on them. There was also extra money allocated to the hard -pressed social care service (for adults and children) but a national grant of some £400 million, though it sounds a lot to us as individuals, doesn't make a huge difference when spread across the whole country. At the time of writing, I don't know exactly how much of that will be allocated to Cambridgeshire, probably about £4 million. To put that in perspective, the Children's Social care budget for the current year is already £3.6 million overspent.

Over the last few years, the budgets for public services have been drastically reduced. Local government funding, the aspect which directly affects what Cambridgeshire County Council can do, has been reduced by 49%. Nationally, £20 billion of welfare cuts have been imposed, nearly 1,000 Sure Start Children's Centres have been closed, as have nearly 500 libraries, so we now have a substantially enfeebled country, in which the most vulnerable are at greatest risk. Nevertheless, looking on the brighter side, Mr Hammond's budget appears to signal a move away from the traditional Thatcherite goal of shrinking the state, acknowledging that the public favours a more social democratic approach. He did

not however go as far as increasing taxation for the highest earners.

The other big uncertainty for the future is, of course, the outcome of the Brexit negotiations. The independent Office for Budget Responsibility predicts that the economy will be smaller by about 2.5% than it would have been if the referendum had not been called.

All these national macro-decisions have an impact for councillors at the bottom micro-end of the public expenditure chain because it is we who face the almost daily calls for more expenditure e.g. 'the High Street pavements need repairing', 'why aren't the verges being cut or the trees trimmed back' etc etc.

Parents with children in local state schools may have noticed that the Chancellor has allocated extra money to schools, amounting to £10,000 for a primary school and £50,000 for a secondary school to enable them to provide the 'little extras'. This phrase has provoked derision from Heads, teachers and governors who are struggling to provide enough teachers and teaching assistants, hardly little extras. The increase equates to about 0.8% of the total schools' budget, which needs to be set against the 8% real term cuts over the last 5 years.

Meanwhile, I continue to work with the Parish Council and other activists in the village to try to improve cycling facilities, to improve the Ouse Valley way path, to resolve the roundabout delays and railway crossing impasse. Progress at times seems slow or non-existent and I know how irritating that must be for those who think obvious solutions can be implemented quickly.

By the time you read this, the village Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire will have closed. Formal results will be announced in January, but first impressions suggest we are a community with a keen interest in business and that there are a very large number of people concerned about the quality of life for those in retirement.

One good bit of good news, the planning and housing development problems we have been having, may be set to get better in the spring because the Huntingdon 2036 Plan has been well received by the planning Inspector and is likely to be approved giving our planners more scope to challenge opportunistic developers.

Lastly traffic on the A1. After a meeting with the road

group at Sandy we are planning to give the problems at Buckden a higher profile by making it a national issue. We are planning a joint Petition to Parliament for the spring. This is a formal procedure and if we get 100,000 signatures, the issue must be raised in Parliament! So if you know of someone with an interest in the A1 and a big Facebook profile, or following on Twitter please let me know!

Buckden Neighbourhood Watch

Motorists' Responsibility for the Safety of Cyclists

Motorists can be the biggest danger to cyclists along with parked cars which can also be hazardous for cyclists. On a single carriageway the legal requirement in the Highway Code is 1.2m separation for a car overtaking a cyclist. For safety, treat the cyclist as you would a car and drive in the overtaking lane, if it is safe do so. If you are driving behind a cyclist, slow down and drive at a distance behind the cyclist, and if there are parked cars in the opposing lane give way to the cyclist. The speed limit is 20 in parts of the village - this is for the safety of all road users. It is important to be aware of cyclists in the roads with parked cars and poor visibility.

Security

Lighting - good lighting can deter a thief. You can fit exterior lights to the front and rear of the house. Exterior security lights are not expensive. Preferred exterior lighting is dawn to dusk lighting rather than lighting with infra red sensors.

Monday Club provides an opportunity to meet up with friendly village ladies who enjoy a regular afternoon event in the Millard Suite in the Village Hall. We meet once a fortnight in the term time from 2.30 to 4.00 and aim to provide a varied programme of events. We book speakers several times a term, and in between those meetings organise our own entertainment eg quizzes, bringing in items of interest to discuss etc. Each meeting finds room for the ubiquitous cup of tea and biscuits and general chat, and we also hold a small raffle. Each member pays a £1 and occasionally brings a small raffle prize. We even have the regular attendance of two dogs who speak most highly of the biscuits!

Twice a year we have an outing, once in November for a pre-Christmas shop usually at the Huntingdon Wyevale Garden centre (it is amusing how the whole of Monday Club descends on the shoe department!), and once in the summer to a place of interest not too far from Buckden. We use the HACT community bus service which is friendly, especially if we manage to secure Paul as driver, who looks after us superbly well. We do have the ability to manage wheelchairs and always visit somewhere that is wheelchair friendly. And of course, we find time for tea and cake or lunch depending on the time of day.

In June we hold a strawberry tea in Jane and Andy Scott's garden weather permitting, where we can enjoy the outdoors under gazebos if the weather is hot, or indoors if not.

We also have a Christmas lunch, usually shortly after Christmas, and the last few years it has been at The Lion where we have been very well looked after by Jill and her team.

Transport is provided to the meetings for anyone who needs it.



Thought for the Month

Greetings!

Christmas is a-coming! If you listen hard, somewhere behind the roar of the school run traffic, the barking dogs and the hiss of leaking headphones you can just discern the faint jingle of sleigh bells. So we turn our thoughts, once more, to the wonderful events of the first Christmas.

Christmas is a time of great celebration in Church, and rightly so. For some, however, Christmas is an ordeal. For those whose lives resonate with Luke's story of Mary and Joseph — alone, unwelcome and suffering great anxiety — Christmas can be a time of almost unbearable stress and pain.

Christmas is also a time when we see people in our Churches who never normally attend. They come for many different reasons. Some just enjoy the celebration; some are seeking an experience of God, conscious-

ly or unconsciously; some are borne down by the weight of their distress and are hoping for comfort and relief.

Whatever their reasons, it is up to us to welcome and accept them. Christmas is a time, above all, to embrace the stranger and offer hospitality and care. Joseph and Mary found a cool reception: only the innkeeper showed them compassion, and then it was half-hearted.

I pray that those who pluck up their courage, those who respond to a whim and those who just come because it is part of their Christmas ritual will all find a warm welcome in our Churches this Christmas. But this is a prayer which we cannot just leave to God to sort out. This is one we have to help God make happen. As we celebrate the outcast God among us, let us also celebrate those among us who are on unfamiliar ground as they join our worship.

Enjoy Christmas and have a happy New Year. God Bless.

Offord and Buckden Angling Society (OBAS)

The Offord and Buckden Angling Society was formed in the early 1800's, and until 1959 benefitted from the Great Northern Railway Station at Offord which, being only 100 yards from the club's water on the River Great Ouse, provided easy access to anglers from the north and south of the country. Some of our members remember travelling on the train with their grandparents and fishing for Chub alongside the great Dick Walker.

Today, the club has access to approximately seven kilometres of top class fishing on the River Great Ouse, located between the Grafham Pumping Station at Offord Cluny and continuing along the river downstream, almost to Brampton. Whether you're looking for a still water, a fast-flowing stream, a small intimate river or one that's wide, languid and deep, OBAS have it. The river is well populated with all types of fresh water fish notably Barbel, Bleak, Bream, Carp, Chub, Dace, Gudgeon, Perch, Pike, Roach, Tench and even Zander. Incredibly Catfish and more unusually Sea Trout are two species that have also been reportedly caught in the past.

OBAS Membership

Adults £25.00, OAP 65+ £10.00, Disabled £7.50, Junior -17 Free Members are entitled to fish all sections and now night fishing is allowed on all sections as well. Our annual membership runs for 12 months from 16th June but note that the 'Close Season' applies to present OBAS waters as of June 2018.


