Speed limits in Buckden and Stirtloe

Residents will know that, for several years, Parish Councillors have been concerned about the speed of traffic through the village. Councillors and volunteers have conducted *Speedwatch* assessments of the traffic in our community on regular occasions.

Over the past year, there has been a vigorous campaign by the 20's Plenty Group who have lobbied for a reduction in the speed limit in our community.

The Parish Council have debated this issue on several occasions during 2015 and have received representations from the public. We recently conducted a survey to assess the views of those who live and/or work in our community. This survey showed 51.55% of respondents would like a reduction to 20 mph, but this result was split evenly between those who want a reduction around the area of the school and those who want a reduction across Buckden and Stirtloe.

The Parish Council debated this issue again at our January meeting, taking the results as well as representations from residents into account, and agreed that we will request Cambridgeshire County Council to create a 20 mph zone around the area of the school, including Buckden Day Nursery. The exact extent of the 20 mph area will be decided in consultation with the county council.

Parents are encouraged to get Sugar Smart

New figures have revealed that 4-10 year olds are estimated to consume over 5,500 sugar cubes a year, the same average weight of a 5 year old. The new data is part of the Change4Life Sugar Smart campaign urging parents to reduce the amount of sugar their children eat. Local health experts are backing the Sugar Smart campaign to highlight the role sugar plays in children's health and the importance of lowering the amount they eat to avoid obesity and other health problems. Obese children are more likely to become obese adults with an increased risk of type-2 diabetes, heart disease and some cancers. Tooth decay is another serious problem associated with high sugar intakes, with approximately 28% of children in England suffering from tooth decay by the age of 5. In Cambridgeshire, over 7% of children aged four to five are overweight or obese. By the time children reach the ages of 10-11 this figure has doubled to 15%. Although there are differences around the county all areas have substantial numbers of children who are either overweight or obese.

Children are having 3 times the maximum recommended amount of sugar. Sugary drinks are the greatest source of sugar in a 4 to 10 year old's diet. Sugar from biscuits, cakes and breakfast cereals contributes almost as much. Surprising amounts of sugar are found in everyday food and drinks. A new Sugar Smart app quickly shows how much sugar products contain by simply scanning the barcode. New government recommendations for daily maximum amounts of sugar are covered by the campaign, such as a total of 24g or 6 cubes of sugar for a 7-10 year old daily.

Cambridgeshire County Council Public Health team are supporting the Change4Life Sugar Swaps campaign. Families can also join in oline by searching Change4Life and downloading the new free app. People can also follow the campaign locally via Cambridgeshire County Councils Facebook page and Twitter feed.

FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

Both the District and County Councils are now wrestling with the problem of how to provide the services that residents expect with an ever decreasing budget. There are certain services which each Council has a statutory obligation to provide and others which have been provided but now may have to face cuts. I am concerned about the future upkeep of the Ouse Valley Way and our local footpath network and will be chairing a meeting of all local Parish Councils involved. In the past there has been an expectation that the HDC should not increase its precept and I wonder whether residents would rather see a small increase rather than lose the loss of services. I will provide an update in the next edition of Roundabout.

We shall soon know the final decision on the A14 and if approved work will soon start on this important improvement to our local road system. I fear that the Village's long battle to keep the A14 bridge over the Brampton Road has been lost. We must now ensure that the works, which will take over four years, will have the minimum adverse effect on the village. The Parish Council has already expressed its concerns about the frequent traffic jams on the Brampton Road leading into Huntingdon. There is an important meeting about the future of the A1 at the end of the month and the Parish Council will receive an update at its February meeting.

Christmas is the season of goodwill and the switching on of the lights, the Christmas Carol service and other local celebrations and festivities all provided the opportunity for local residents to meet and get to know their neighbours a little better. All this good will was marred by the person who stole the jar containing the Lion Hotel staff tips: I cannot wish them a happy new year but hope they feel some contrition and shame.

After the jollity of the December meeting, January saw Liz Davies, Curator of St Neots Museum, giving us an insight into Crime and Punishment in St. Neots. Liz introduced her subject with a general overview of punishment from the earliest days. She then gave a heartbreaking sight of the Habitual Criminals Register for the 1870s. Photos of the poor and

disadvantaged accompanied details of their generally minor crimes and the sentence given were hard to hear. Girls of 13 and 14 served periods of hard labour and then were sent for up to 5 years in Reform Schools where they toiled in laundries for the profit of the school. The past really is another country!

The next meeting will be held on February 3rd, when the speaker will be Gordon Ryall, a coroner in Peterborough for 40 years, 7.30pm in the Conference Room at Buckden Towers, visitors are always welcome.

The Migrant Crisis

I did find it ironic that the irrelevance of recognising the acute needs of a single homeless family from the Middle East was referred to when our attention was focussed then on just such a human dilemma. May I quote from the recent letter, sent by the Churches in St. Neots and published in the Hunts Post of the 23rd of December, in which they collectively argued that "as Christians we are compelled by the teachings of our faith to care for the stranger and it is not acceptable to be passive in the face of this crisis."

I note Mr Davies does not mention the fact that there has been a brutal civil war raging in Syria for 5 years now, with no sign of it abating. Millions of human beings have as a result been displaced, hundreds of thousands have been killed or maimed. Millions of refugees have already been absorbed by Jordan, Lebanon and Turkey, with millions more internally displaced in Syria itself. So we will return "those people" to exactly what. To tents, prefabricated huts and shipping containers in the middle of a harsh winter. To camps where food rations are inadequate and subject to cuts, to a situation where you are not allowed to work or seek employment, where you have little or no access to money, where your children receive little or no education and where it is entirely possible that you will have to tolerate such a purgatorial limbo indefinitely. I wonder, in such dreadful circumstances, what I would do? If I could muster the courage and resolve I might well choose to attempt the almost Biblical odyssey that we daily witness on our screens and in our newspapers. I might aspire to a better life for my family. For there are no "safe havens", no "UN peacekeeping", with the war grinding remorselessly on. I might recall the UK was so compassionate as to admit 216 Syrians to their country in the preceding 4 years, and follow the rules and be a well behaved and deserving refugee, thus appealing to politicians.

Mindful of the limited space available may I close with a general observation. Some of the discourse in our media and political parties reminds me of the proposition suggested by Harry Lime in The Third Man, you know the lines on the Ferris Wheel, where he invited the audience to imagine those people viewed from a distance as ants or dots on the ground. But the refugees have been so unkind and discourteous as to confront us with the immediacy and depth of their needs. How will we respond?

Thought for the month

We are privileged to live in a delightful part of England in the Ouse Valley, with Grafham Water close by and the Nene Valley also relatively close. I am sure our hearts continue to reach out to those who over recent weeks, including Christmas and New Year, experienced flooding in their homes and communities. They are now struggling to repair and rebuild their homes and trying to come to terms with what happened.

A number of disasters have recently been taking place in various parts of the world also some atrocities, and the desperate plight of refugees seeking peace and freedom continues. There have been some people who have expressed their views that there cannot be a God in Heaven who would allow such things to happen; it is unreasonable and irrational to place one's faith in a God like that. The Christian message however portrays a God of justice and mercy who would not act in a destructive way like that – it would be contrary to His nature.

I believe three important lessons come to us when such tragedies occur. Surely here is the One Person we can turn to in such situations. Through personal faith we can know God's love, power and protection at all times and most certainly in adverse circumstances. Here is our hope, our confidence and our salvation.

Secondly, it is a timely reminder to all of us that mankind is small and insignificant in the face of the mighty forces at work within this universe. The vastness of space, together with the yet undiscovered galaxies beyond, serve as reminders that despite our vast knowledge we still know relatively little. Perhaps this serves in a sobering way to remind us that there are limits and boundaries to man's strength and capabilities.





On the 3rd December 2015, Neighbourhood Watch National held an event called 'The Way Ahead for Neighbourhood Watch'. - Cambs Countryside Watch, working in close partnership with the Cambridgeshire Constabulary, taking part in reducing crime and making Cambridgeshire a safe place to live in.

There is a need to bring together all partners who wish to help residents to live in safe and crime free Cambridgeshire.

BUCKDEN CHURCH OF ENGLAND SCHOOL (Primary Academy Trust)


January 2016






