As many readers will know, there is to be an appeal hearing with regards to the proposed Lucks Lane housing development.

The Parish Council view is that we totally support the Huntingdonshire District Council in their initial rejection of this application and will continue to support their arguments against the development at the appeal stage. Furthermore, the Parish Council has applied for Pula 6 status, which means that we will

the Parish Council has applied for Rule 6 status, which means that we will be able to take an active part in the appeal. We intend to supplement the District Council's points with arguments of our own, based on our unique, local knowledge.

At the time of writing, we are fairly sure that the appeal will run from 16 - 24 May, excluding the weekend and Monday 22 May. The venue has, as yet, to be decided but the appeal **may** take place in the Village Hall. We'll keep you informed about this.

I was very pleased that at the December meeting of the County Council the motion that I put to Council asking for

Drug Abuse

I have received reports that the use of drugs has increased in Buckden and Southoe and that dealers have been seen plying their trade in the village. Whilst the use of 'legal drugs' has support by many, their use can escalate to abuse of far more dangerous substances. This is particularly worrying for the younger elements of our community. I urge residents who have any evidence about the sale of drugs to report it to the police.

Road Closures and Diversion Signs

There have been some incidents involving misleading road closure and diversion signs. Both the Parish Clerk and I have contacted Highways England and the A14 Project Team and sorted out immediate problems and hopefully there will be no further difficulties. Contact the A14 Project team, Parish Clerk or me if you become aware of any future misleading signs.

Buckden/Offords Main Line Level Crossing

The County Council has unanimously supported the Parish and District Councils' efforts to accelerate the closure of the main line level crossing and replace it with a bridge. This is good news and will enable us to put more pressure on the responsible Minister. The delays that we all experience continue to get worse - I understand that during the recent road traffic survey there was one occasion that the gates were closed for 68 minutes during a 2 hour period.



Thought for the month

Dear Friends,

This year, 2017, marks the 800th anniversary of the appointment of the first priest at St Mary's Buckden. Although there has been a worshipping presence in Buckden for much longer (the church is recorded in the Domesday Book of 1086), the first recorded priest was Rev William de Bugden who was licensed some time in 1217. If our records are correct he served until 1279, our longest serving incumbent. There have since been 68 priests, and so I am the 70th incumbent. Their length of service has varied between 59 years in the case of Rev de Bugden to less than a year in the case of Robert Parsons who died the same year he was licensed in 1411, and we have recently had 2 female priests, Revs Margaret Smith and Ally Barrett. All have sought to minister to and serve the village and surrounding community in their own time and context and to faithfully teach and share the significance of the Christian faith.

Wherever we stand on matters of faith, we think that the presence and the role of the church as a part of our community, as well as being a place of worship and spiritual support, is an event that the village may wish to celebrate. And so through the year there will be a series of articles and events in the Roundabout and elsewhere which will highlight St Mary's role in the community and in people's lives and the significance of the church in village life. We will also be inviting people to engage with us as we seek to do the repairs and refurbishment necessary to preserve the church for the next 800 years.

The Bible acknowledges that as people and as a community we have a variety of faith standpoints. But Jesus makes the ringing promise that he came to us bring life in all its fullness, and that is an invitation which is open to all. So please come and join us in celebrating that life over the past eight centuries.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE DISCLOSURE SCHEME

The Keeping Children Safe Disclosure Scheme (also known as 'Sarah's law) is a national scheme which allows anyone who has an interest in the welfare of a named child or children to formally enquire whether an individual who has access to a child has a record of child sexual offences and/or poses a significant risk of harm to a child. For example, a grandparent may enquire about their son's new partner who is living or staying in the same house as their grandchild.

If it is in the child's interest for certain information to be disclosed, it will only be provided to the person most responsible for the child's welfare (usually parents, guardians or carers). The scheme can be used to find out about all child-related offences and information which is beneficial to disclose to protect a child from the risk of significant harm. This scheme does not replace existing arrangements for vetting and safeguarding children.

LAWN/GARDEN CARE IN FEBRUARY

Moss: Moss will start to encroach now and it is advisable to treat now before it competes with the lawn. Don't wait until the spring.

Aeration: Soil compaction is a frequent cause of turf deterioration and moss invasion. For optimal effectiveness the lawn needs aerating in autumn/winter.
Mower Servicing: The grass should now be dormant so make sure your mower goes in for its annual service and blade sharpening in readiness for Feb/March mowing!
Garden Tidy: A good time of year to prune back shrubs and tidy borders to make room for spring bulbs emerging soon.
