

Victoria Cross Commemoration An honour for Buckden and an invitation to all

Buckden Parish Council would like to invite all residents to the unveiling of the commemorative paving stone for Captain John Green, VC, which will take place on 1st July 2016, exactly 100 years since the award of the Victoria Cross was made.

Buckden can be proud that Captain John Green, RAMC, Medical Officer to the 1/5th Sherwood Foresters, was born in Buckden. Coneygarths, on the High Street, was home to the family for several generations. Captain Green was awarded a posthumous VC for his conspicuous devotion to duty during the morning of 1st July 1916, the first day of the Battle of the Somme. We should be particularly proud in Buckden as, of the 454 VC's awarded to UK born citizens during the First World War, only 2 were born in what is now Cambridgeshire.

We will also be commemorating the sacrifice of all the sons of Buckden and Stirtloe that lost their lives during the First World War. We are very fortunate that some relatives of those listed on the War Memorial in St Mary's Churchyard are able to attend the Ceremony.

The Commemoration Ceremony will begin at 11 a.m. at the Green Memorial on the High St, opposite The Towers. We will then proceed to the War Memorial in St Mary's Churchyard, where the stone will be unveiled. Following the Commemoration Ceremony, there will be an exhibition of work about the First World War by children at Buckden School. This will take place in the Methodist Hall, where light refreshments will also be available. Medals may be worn.

Please remember that all are welcome to attend the very special Ceremony of Commemoration.

FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

Following on from the Government's announcement recently that the **A14** has been given the go ahead residents in Buckden will shortly be seeing work starting on the compounds which are to be sited just north of Buckden on the side of the A1. This will be a construction compound and will be used as one of the bases for the engineers and staff involved in the construction of the new road.

A second compound is to be built near Godmanchester and it is hoped that most of the construction of the new A14 Huntingdon southern bypass will take place off line, which means that it should not disrupt the route network.

FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR Devolution

Residents will, no doubt, have read or heard in the media that there are Government plans to devolve some powers to locally elected mayors. The original plan for us was for an area covering the whole of Norfolk, Suffolk, Cambridge and Peterborough. The view of local authorities was that this would not be a sensible plan and an alternative has now been proposed. The new Devolution Deal would see the transfer of some powers from Central Government to Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. The details of the deal are not ready for publication at the time of writing this report. When they are they will be discussed and a vote taken at a special District Council meeting on 29th June. If agreed by all of the local authorities involved Cambridgeshire and Peterborough will establish a Combined Authority with a directly elected Mayor in place by May 2017 with interim arrangements in place in 2016/17. The new directly elected Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Mayor will act as the Chair to the new Combined Authority. The other members of this board will be nominated by the authorities concerned.

When full details are available and agreed I shall ensure that residents are kept informed.

Hinchingbrooke Hospital

I share residents' concerns about the future of Hinchingbrooke Hospital. I am a member of the HDC Overview and Scrutiny Panel (Communities and Environment) and we shall be meeting the CEO of the Hospital on 28th June to discuss the issues raised by residents. As always I shall endeavour to keep you informed.

The walk will last about 2 hours; shorter options will be available, but unfortunately the walk is not suitable for pushchairs or wheelchairs.



Financially it was very successful, raising just under £3,300, which is more than last year, despite the weather. Many thanks to Anne Furbank Ltd for their generous sponsorship.





CAPTAIN JOHN GREEN VC

The 1st July this year is both the 100th anniversary of the first day of the Battle of the Somme and the 100th anniversary of the day on which Captain John Green RAMC, born in Buckden, won a posthumous Victoria Cross while serving with 1/5 Sherwood Foresters in the diversionary attack on Gommecourt. As you probably know, all VCs are being commemorated by paving stones presented, in each case, on the anniversary of the day when the award was won, so the one that is special to our village will be presented on 1st July.







NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH (NHW) BEWARE THE SUPERMARKET CAR PARK SCAM

Be wary of anyone who approaches you in the supermarket car park. Thieves watch as their victims enter their pin numbers at supermarkets checkouts .This is known as "shoulder surfing" by police.

Typically known for being a technique used at cashpoints before a card is snatched, it's also spreading to supermarkets and other stores.

Beware of thieves working in pairs, following victims to the car park before finding a way to distract them. This may, for example, be asking for directions or pointing out a supposed flat tyre. Meanwhile their accomplice steals the victim's wallet.

DODGY PAYMENT REQUESTS

Fraudsters are targeting members of the public who are expecting to make a payment for property repairs. The fraudsters, via email, will purport to be a tradesman who has recently completed work at the property and use a similar email address to that of the genuine tradesman. They will ask for funds to be transferred via bank transfer and once payment is made the victims of the fraud soon realise they have been deceived when the genuine tradesman requests payment for their services.


