The judges will consider both creative and technical merit in making their choice. The overall winner of each age category will be awarded the trophy for that age, and there will also be modest cash prizes for winners of each theme. The judge's decision is final.

#### Reporting an issue on the Ouse Valley Way

A 26-mile section of the Ouse Valley Way runs through Huntingdonshire, going from St Neots to Earith. Many residents of Buckden use the section of the Ouse Valley Way between Paxton and Huntingdon and the Parish Council regularly gets reports of problems with the path such as fallen trees or flooded sections. The responsibility for the maintenance of the path lies with Cambridgeshire County Council, who is responsible for public rights of way in Cambridgeshire.

To report an issue on the Ouse Valley Way footpath, please contact Cambridgeshire County Council on 0345 0455212 or via their website using the following link which will take you directly to the 'Report a problem' section <a href="https://highwaysreporting.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/">https://highwaysreporting.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/</a>

You then have to plot the location on the map by zooming in as far as possible. Once you have clicked on the position of the issue you can then log its details.

#### FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

The two main items the County Council has been tackling recently are:

- The proposal to move CCC HQ from Cambridge to Alconbury Weald. This has now been agreed (by a majority vote, not unanimous) and it is expected that the County Council will be re-located in 2020 or 2021. The aim is to save money on the running of the Council by having fewer staff in a central building and more staff working from buildings dispersed across the county. Selling or leasing Shire Hall, which enjoys a prominent position in Cambridge, would also raise money for the County. Many concerns were expressed about accessibility of the new site and also about the wisdom of making a major move of this kind when the future of local government hangs in the balance.
- b. The serious deterioration of the roads, partly due to inadequate maintenance over many years and specifically arising from the recent cold weather. To his credit, the Leader of the Council has apologised: 'We could and should have done better'. New equipment has been purchased and we are now promised a more rapid and more long-lasting repair programme.

The shadow hanging over the Council is the shortage of money and the certainty of further cutbacks in future. Strenuous efforts are being made to 'transform' the way services are being provided but the demand is increasing i.e. an increasing proportion of young children with special needs and with domestic upheaval and increased longevity with the adult social care costs implicit in that.

I am always happy to discuss any aspect of County business with whoever is keen to know more.

If you wish to raise any local matters with me personally and would welcome a face-to-face conversation, I come to the Aragon Room in the Village Hall at 7 p.m. on the evening of the parish council meeting, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday in the month. #### FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

This is my first column as your new District Councillor. I would like to thank everyone who put their trust in me and voted. I will endeavour to earn that trust and work hard for all the residents of Buckden, Southoe, Diddington, Stirtloe and Midloe. I would also like to thank, on behalf of all residents, Terry Hayward, for his long service as my predecessor. He leaves very big shoes for me to fill.

I am keen to speak to residents to learn more about your concerns and how I can best work on your behalf. I have already had a few calls from residents concerned about rubbish collection and the rise in heavy truck traffic through Buckden from the A14 roadworks. Living on the High Street in Buckden with my teenaged children, I am personally concerned about the rise in crime in our village, albeit from modest levels. The congestion at the roundabout and improved access to the A1 continue to be universal concerns. Terry Hayward has worked hard on this latter issue and I will continue to work with him to improve access for all villagers.

Annual Parish Council Meeting, 22<sup>nd</sup> May 7 pm – James Palmer, Mayor of the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority. Our Mayor addressed the Parish Council last month, and I will summarise his thoughts in my next column. The Mayor has a large budget with the power to influence the future of our village, particularly in the areas of traffic management, health and social care and other essential amenities. However, there are many demands on his budget and his strategic priorities, and it is essential that we residents bring our needs to his attention. I will do what I can to facilitate that.

Local Activities As the days lengthen and the weather dries out at long last, I encourage everyone to get out and enjoy all the wonderful nature and sports activities our region offers. From my sitting room, I can see all the cyclists riding through the pedestrian tunnel and continuing their circuit from Grafham Water through the village and onwards. The Village Hall offers free tennis courts and the Paxton Pits Nature reserve is organising several guided walks to learn more about our local fauna and flora. The famous Buckfest is also fast approaching on 14 July, although the event is, as always, completely sold out!

Transport Those of you who commute daily to London like my wife will be aware that our train network underwent a significant change from 20 May with an increased number of trains running from St Neots to Kings Cross and St Pancras. This is a very busy route, and I know that many are dissatisfied with our transport service. The increased housing development in our area, while very necessary, will put increased pressure on our transport infrastructure including parking at the train stations and bus access to the station. Mayor James Palmer has stated that improving transport infrastructure is his priority to support economic growth in our region. I feel strongly that improved transport is a key issue — including roads, bus transport and safe cycle lanes.

I encourage people to contact me to raise any issues, and I will also set up regular monthly surgeries in each of the villages. More on this in the next issue of the Roundabout. I look forward to hearing from you.

#### **BUCKDEN NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH**

Please be vigilant. Cambridgeshire County Council's Community Protection Team are warning of a police impersonator scam running in Cambridgeshire. The scam involves fraudsters phoning individuals pretending to be a police officer and asking them to withdraw money from their bank accounts as part of an undercover investigation. Your bank and the police will never ask you to withdraw cash, reveal your PIN number or passwords.

**WATCH OUT FOR THE CALL-BACK TRICK**: Sometimes the scammers will suggest you call your bank or the police to confirm their details but what they do is stay on the line when you hang up to prevent the call being terminated. You think you are speaking to someone genuine from the bank or police when it is actually still the criminals.

**TOP TIP**: Always use another phone or wait least 10 minutes before making a call to check a caller's authenticity. If you believe you or a family member has been a victim, please call the police on 101. There is a consumer helpline on 03454 04 05 06 if you are concerned about phone call or doorstep caller.



Dear friends,

Spring and summer seem to finally be here. I hope like me that you have been able to enjoy this outburst of new life as nature has suddenly sprung into action. And it has all happened so quickly; the Magnolia tree outside my study window seemed to go from bud to bloom in about three days. Coincidentally (or not) here at St Mary's we are enjoying an upsurge in the number of baptisms – I'll leave you to decide if there is any connection!

I think there is something fresh, vibrant and exciting in seeing new life emerge, whether in the fresh spring colours of flowers and vegetation and young lambs or the greater, deeper potential of a growing human life.

By definition all of us reading this will have passed the 'young lambs' stage. But whatever stage we may be the potential for new things to think about, pray about or do still exists in all of us. 

#### **Buckden Tennis Club**





#### LAWN CARE IN JUNE



"Spruce up your lawn for BBQ's, Wimbledon and The World Cup"

#### Mowing

Continue mowing, and increase the frequency. Try cutting one way then cut at 90 degrees to it to give that crisscrossed fairway look. The grass will look and grow better if cut little and often, rather than one big cut. This month cut no lower than ¾ inch (2 cm).

> **Top Tip** - Stems: You may need to rake stems upright that creep through the lawn so they stand up and the mower can cut them.

#### Organic Fertiliser/Seaweed Treatment

Apply either a liquid or granular feed to bring out the best in your lawn at this time of year. We use an organic feed as granule or in a seaweed form. It really does work wonders.

#### Patio/Driveway Weed Control

Weeds can look unsightly at this time of year in patios and driveways. We can spray a total weed killer to kill them and keep weed free for up to 6 months.

#### **Disease Alert- Red Thread**

It may necessary to spray a fungicide to cure the problem. If you do notice areas of "red thread" please call us and we will advise accordingly.

#### Actions required in June

- Mow lawn lightly; don't cut shorter than ¾ inches (2 cm) this month. Grass will respond better if cut little and often
- Treat weeds with herbicide once actively growing
- Feed lawn with an Organic fertiliser
- Treat weeds on driveways, paths and patios
- Red Thread Disease Control may be needed
