Buckden Parish Council is seeking to appoint a self-motivated, forward thinking and enthusiastic person to fill the post of Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer. The Clerk is responsible for managing the day to day business of the Council and is required to provide professional support and guidance in respect of all aspects of the Council's work. They will frequently act as the public face of the council.

Applicants will need an administrative and financial background, excellent communication skills, and a good knowledge of IT office applications, in particular Excel. Preferably they will have a working knowledge of local government law and procedures or show they have the potential and willingness to learn with training. FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

February brings the budget setting process by both District and County councils. The Cambridgeshire County Council budget meeting is to be held on February 14th 2017 so as you read this article the County Council will have made their decision regarding the level of council tax for 2017-2018 and residents will be receiving their council tax notices through the post from Huntingdonshire District Council. Cambridgeshire County Council is again faced with the decision whether to include a 2% Adult social care precept increase on the council tax alongside a possible additional 2% council tax increase giving a possible 4% council tax increase by County Council alone. This is before our district colleagues have made a decision about whether to increase their portion of the council tax and the Fire Authority and Police and Crime Commissioner and the individual parish councils.

Please be advised that residents can come along to the Buckden Village Hall on the second Tuesday of the month at 6.30pm for an hour to speak to me. I will be in the Aragon room and no appointment is necessary. My next and final surgery will be held on **Tuesday 14th March 2017**.

FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

A1 AND RAILWAY CROSSING TRAFFIC PROBLEMS

I continue to receive comments, almost daily, about the traffic on the A1 and the problems which result when the Buckden/Offord Main Line level crossing is closed. The situation has not improved in recent months and is forecast to get worse when the new A14 and improvements to the A428 are completed. The problems on the A1 are not just experienced by residents of Buckden, Stirtloe and Diddington but also by those living in Southoe. The village's only ingress and egress is via the A1 and any attempt to leave the village and travel south is perilous to say the least. I have arranged a meeting between the A1 Safety Advisory Group, Highways England and our local MP, Jonathan Djanogly. The purpose of the meeting will be to discuss the possibility of local improvements in the event of the major M25 to Brampton Hut rerouting being delayed.

20 MPH LIMIT

The new 20 mph speed limit is now in place. Let us hope that it improves road safety in the village, particularly in the area around the school. I hope that parents delivering and collecting their children will help road safety by parking sensibly and in the appropriate places.

PROPOSED NEW DEVELOPMENT

If the developer's appeal is successful the resultant extra traffic will increase the number of vehicles in the village, on the A1 and at the level crossing. This is just one of the reasons that I, the Parish Council, the Protect Buckden's Future Group and so many of you are opposing the plan. Let us hope that we are successful. The Public Inquiry is programmed to start on Tuesday 16th May and proceedings will be open to the public.



I was recently reading of someone who visited an ice-rink and watched a teenage girl trying to perfect an extremely difficult jump. She had a coach with her seeking to give help and advice. With one fall she did not get up and the look on her face apparently showed total discouragement. Her coach again helped her up and told her to try again. Another fall followed but this time she got up immediately and skated around the rink several times with increasing speed, then came the jump and she succeeded with a twist and a turn included and a perfect landing. She stayed motionless for a few moments enjoying the sense of achievement and her coach applauded.

PROTECT BUCKDEN'S FUTURE GROUP TO OPPOSE LUCKS LANE DEVELOPMENT AT PUBLIC INQUIRY – BUT WE NEED YOUR HELP!

On 23rd January 2017, the Protect Buckden's Future Group held a Public Meeting and we thank the 132 residents who attended and contributed both advice and funds. We outlined what we have done so far and what we intend to do to stop the developer Gladman's proposal to build 180 houses off Lucks Lane.

The PBF are a constituted group with elected officers who, for ten months, have coordinated with local and national authorities, conducted thorough research, informed the public via the Roundabout and other media, and encouraged 221 residents to contact the Hunts District Council to oppose this scheme.

HDC with support from PBF, the Buckden Parish Council and the public, refused planning permission based on the following grounds: 1). Erosion of rural character gap between Buckden and Stirtloe. 2). The proposal illustrated cramped, poor quality housing. 3). Possible destruction of archaeology. 4). The anticipated increase in traffic from the site would make it 'extremely likely' that collisions of 'serious harm' would result at the Stirtloe Lane/A1 junction. 5). The developers were unable to show that the effect on local traffic would not be severe. 6). Possible flooding risk from Grafham Water. 7). HDC can rely upon their 5-year housing plan to adequately cover local development without the need for this proposal.

The PBF further stated that: a). No development should be considered until the effects of the re-routings of the A14, A428 and possibly A1, and the Alconbury and Brampton developments were known. b). The safety of pedestrians, dog walkers etc. would be jeopardised by the extra traffic on Lucks Lane/Stirtloe Lane. c). Under new government guidelines, Gladman would only be required to build 'affordable' houses at 80% of local house values and rents, not truly social housing.

Our best means of opposing this development was to use local knowledge and focus on traffic congestion and safety, and in November over 90 locals helped us conduct a traffic survey, which has proved most useful.

We have retained planning and traffic consultants who will be our main witnesses at the upcoming **Public Inquiry starting on 16**th **May 2017 in Buckden Village Hall**. PLEASE ATTEND IF YOU CAN, TO SHOW THE INSPECTOR THE EXTENT OF LOCAL OPPOSITION.

To date, we nine people have covered the cost of all these expenses, but NOW WE NEED YOUR HELP AND FUNDING! The more money we can raise to pay for consultants' time, research and related expenses, the better chance we have of stopping this development at the Public Inquiry; e.g. an official traffic count and speed survey on one lane costs £360; surveying the A1 roundabout would cost £960, the official record of Buckden road traffic incidents costs £100.

Buckden residents saved themselves thousands of pounds by being alert after receiving a phone call and later a letter informing them they had won a prize.

It was a scam! They received a phone call and were told they had won £350,000. To collect the prize there would be a charge of 1 % for insurance - to cover the money whilst being posted to the residents address, and a 5% extra charge for an agents fee. The next question was; YOUR BANK DETAILS PLEASE.

The phone call and letter were a scam. You can tell by checking phone numbers and addresses. Do not give any bank details away; end the telephone call; check details - did you have a ticket from this company? If you can, check the address and telephone number on the website. Any doubts, call the fraud line on 0300 123 2040

HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF

- Never disclose security details such as your PIN or full banking password
- Don't assume an email, text or phone call is authentic
- Don't be rushed a genuine organisation won't mind waiting
- Listen to your instincts you know if something doesn't feel right
- Stay in control don't panic and make a decision you'll regret

BUCKDEN CHURCH OF ENGLAND SCHOOL (Primary Academy Trust)

March 2017

February is always one of our quieter months at school. The children have been working hard, many of them preparing for their tests in the summer term.

This month Safety Internet Awareness has been highlighted to the children in school. This is a global initiative with the theme 'Be the change: unite for a better internet'. The children have been learning how to stay safe on the internet and our parents came into school so they could see what the children had been learning about how to stay safe. Many of you may have seen our Facebook post - it reached over 160,000 people worldwide in less than 24 hours. This was an exercise to demonstrate to the children how easy it is to access information using social networking.

The children in our Gardening Club are planning to build a greenhouse using plastic bottles. We are collecting 2-litre plastic bottles, preferably clear although green bottles will be acceptable. 
