Police presence in Buckden

The Buckden Village Plan that was published recently highlighted the concern that some residents felt about what they perceived as a lack of police presence in Buckden. However, those who attended our Annual Parish Meeting, and listened to the report given by PCSO Alan Newman, will have heard about the cuts in personnel which have meant that our PCSO has a much larger geographical area to patrol and that police presence is, inevitably, focused on areas of higher crime than Buckden.

Residents do not need to feel isolated from the police, though. One excellent way of keeping in touch with crime patterns in our area, and of receiving information to prevent you being a victim of crime, including cyber-crime, is to sign up to receive information from **eCops**, the on-line information service of the Cambridgeshire Constabulary. To sign up, simply go to: <u>www.cambs.police.uk/ecops/</u>

Parish Council Website

Can we also please remind residents that the Buckden Village Plan can be found on the Parish Council and Roundabout websites, and that hard copies can be obtained from the Clerk and from the library.

We have received two documents relating to flooding from Cambridgeshire County Council which you can also find on our website. These are *Emergency flood response contacts* and *Riparian Owner factsheet* (Yes, we had to look it up as well. A riparian owner is someone with land adjoining, above or with a water course running through it.)

Dogs

Dog fouling was also an issue for residents in the Village Plan. Whilst we appreciate that the vast majority of dog owners do a first class job of clearing up after their pets, there are still instances of dog fouling in the village, particularly around the recreation field. Please clear up after your dog and remember that poop bags are available at a very reasonable price from the Clerk.

We would also request that owners ensure that dogs are kept under control at all times. One of the Roundabout deliverers was recently bitten on the arm by a dog in its owner's garden and could have been more badly injured had the owner not intervened. Please could dog owners also remember that the recreation field is also an area for children to play, as well as for dogs to be exercised. My small grandchildren were recently terrified by a large dog, off its lead, that kept running at us but that 'only wanted to play'.

Parking in the High Street

Last month, we wrote about traffic safety near Buckden School. The other key area of traffic concern for residents is the parking in the High Street, which causes significant congestion at times and difficulties for the bus to get through. The Parish Council is proud of our busy and vibrant High Street, so different from many communities, but would again appeal for considerate parking, that takes account of the single white lines, to ensure that traffic keeps moving. This is particularly important while the three-way traffic light system is in operation.

The monthly meeting of the **Parish Council, including a 15 minute Public Forum will be held on Tuesday 11th November 2014 starting at 7.30pm** in the Village Hall. Members of the public are welcome to attend and raise any Buckden related issues.

If required, the **Parish Council's Planning Committee** will meet on **Tuesday 11th and Tuesday 25th November** starting 7pm. Agendas for the meetings are posted on the Parish Council notice boards not later than the Saturday preceding the meeting

FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

BUCKDEN POST OFFICE

I have received numerous complaints about the service provided by the Post office in the One Stop Stores. I have spoken to both the PO's Senior Stakeholder Manager for the East of England and the One Stop Area Manager. The latter admits that the service provided has not been satisfactory and I have arranged to meet him on Saturday 11th October to discuss the situation.

A1 SAFETY ADVISORY GROUP

I am now the Chairman of the Group which met recently to discuss various issues concerning the A1. The Police representative reported that over 1,500 motorists had received either points or 'speed training' for exceeding the 60 mph limit on the A1. The Southoe members reported that it was now easier to enter and exit the Village. This appears to indicate that the new average speed cameras are a success. Questions continue to be raised about the speed of traffic approaching the Buckden Roundabout.

The Highways Agency representative provided an update on the future plans for local trunk roads including the A1. We emphasised the need to have the A1 problems properly identified in The Cambridgeshire Long Term Transport Strategy and the Highways Agency Route Strategy Evidence Report. I have been asked to contact our MP and that for NE Bedfordshire to ask for their support for an Action Group to represent the villages along the route between Sandy and Brampton Hut.

I continue to press for a common sense solution to the pollution and congestion problems that will arise when the viaduct over the Brampton Road is removed.

PROPOSED BUCKDEN TO GRAFHAM WATER CYCLE/FOOT PATH.

I have now received the names of over ten residents to volunteer to join a Working Group which will meet for the first time on Thursday 16th October in the Village Hall.

FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR

November and December will be budget setting months and across all local authorities there will be some difficult choices and decisions to be made.

The first few years of cuts make an organisation more efficient in the way that organisation runs as it looks to make efficiencies and 'cuts the fat'. In 2013 the Local Government Association laid the foundations of their response to the challenges that public services face with their campaign, Rewiring Public Services.

Rewiring Public services is an ambitious campaign which provides much needed solutions to how local authorities can deliver public services with an ever tightening fiscal environment. Smaller budgets and ever increasing demands on those smaller budgets have made it necessary for local authorities to think of innovative ways in which less can provide more.

From this background comes projects such as 'Making Assets Count' in which partners come together to unlock potential in under used assets. Local authorities are already pooling recourses and sharing services to make themselves more efficient and work to a leaner budget.

With this in mind, the County Council have debated 3 motions on October 14th 2014 proposing that the County Council make further savings by moving to a unitary authority.


As I write this article the debate has not taken place so I am unable to give you the outcome of these debates in this months article.

The level of further savings that the County Council are required to make will start to impact on the level of services that the council can provide and so it is even more vital that all avenues be explored in trying to find solutions to the age old problem of making less go further.

Thought for the month

In many Christian Churches the 1st November is the feast of All Saints. This is a day when we remember not just the saints who have a special day, like St. Andrew on 30th November, but all the saints in heaven. That includes not just those who have been officially recognised as saints but all those who have gone before us in faith and are now in heaven. In this sense we will all have saints in our families.

The feast of All Saints is preceded by Halloween which now seems to have little connection with Christianity but rather with trick-or-treating, apple bobbing and dressing up as witches etc. The name actually means All Hallows Eve. Hallows being an old English word meaning holy or saintly which we still use when we say the Lord's Prayer, 'hallowed be thy name'.

Halloween then, in a Christian context, is a day for preparing to celebrate the feast of All Saints by clearing out of our lives all that stops us from being saints ourselves. As an alternative to the usual Halloween activities, the Buckden Churches this year organised for the children an 'Angels and Saints' event at the Methodist church from 5-6pm on the 31st October. Perhaps this is the emphasis that should be placed on All Hallows Eve.

All Saints' Day is followed by the commemoration of All Souls. Both days commemorate the dead but the difference between them is that the first celebrates those in heaven and in the second we pray for those who have gone before us in faith but are in a place of purgatory being purged of their sins before reaching heaven. We ask the former to pray for us whilst we in turn pray for the latter. This is what we mean in the Christian Creed when we say that we believe 'in the communion of saints' the community of the living and the dead forming one body in Christ.

What is Timebanking? Would it work in Buckden?

Timebanking is a way for people to come together and help each other by exchanging knowledge, help and skills.



Timebanking works by

• People helping others in a community. This could include helping someone with their shopping if they are housebound or helping a community group with an event.

• By giving your time, you can then deposit your help as a 'time credit'.

You can store further credits and withdraw them by asking for help yourself. This could be asking for help with computing, minor DIY or help with cutting the grass.

Most Timebanks have a co-ordinator who matches people's skills and arranges time exchanges. They keep a record of all the members 'banked' hours. Timebanking has been found to have positive health and social benefits for communities. Currently, there are Timebanks operating locally in Cambridge, Cambourne, Littleport, St Ives, St Neots and Somersham.

The Parish Council will hold a Timebanking evening on **Wednesday 19th November 2014 at 7.30 p.m. in the Lincoln Room of the Village Hall.** This evening will give more information about Timebanking and will discuss whether this is a suitable venture for Buckden. NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH (NHW)

Tit-bits from the County Annual NW Conference.

The annual meeting of the Cambridgeshire NW Association provides an opportunity for the police to brief it on matters of mutual interest and to be updated by members of the County and National NW organisations. Items of general interest from the recent meeting were:

- The Chief Constable announced that, despite the significant fall in his budget over the last few years, he has managed to retain most of his regular officers but has had to make a large cut in the number of PCSO (Police Community Support Officers). Nevertheless, crime levels are down by an average of 25% especially those against the person.
- He reviewed the steady change in crime patterns. Not surprisingly, thefts of TVs, DVDs and the like were going down as resale values fell but theft of hand-held devices was rising. Crimes involving vehicles reflected the improvements being made in their protection: the newest and most desirable cars only being targeted by well organised criminal gangs.
- The reduced physical threat to property and people in general is being offset by a rapid rise in internet crime which is becoming more widespread and increasingly sophisticated and organised.
- Why do we see fewer police on the streets? The CC responded to this common complaint by emphasising that the most effective use of his (reducing) budget was in the prevention of crime and the protection of people rather than property. ("Detection of sexual exploitation and domestic violence; not litter and pickpockets"). This called for better intelligence, surveillance of suspected criminals and personal contacts with the vulnerable and victims of crime, much of which was done 'behind the scenes' and out of uniform.
- As a corollary to the above, the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) has appointed a new member of staff to develop better ways of engaging with the public eg. the use of 'contact points' in supermarkets.
- The shortcomings of the 101 system were recognised and the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) was considering reinstating part of the budget which had been taken out of the service.
- Cambridgeshire has the highest incidence of farm thefts in the UK!


