# Buckden Parish Council News



## **Speed limits in Buckden and Stirtloe – LET US KNOW YOUR VIEW**

Most residents will have seen publicity from the 20s Plenty group. This campaign group, lobbying for a speed limit of 20 mph throughout the current 30 mph areas of Buckden and Stirtloe, has been very active in persuading a significant number of residents, and those who regularly travel through Buckden and Stirtloe, to support the notion of a 20 mph limit.

The Parish Council is aware that this policy has a great deal of support but we have also had a number of residents arguing against a possible reduction in the speed limit. Therefore, before we take any action, the council has decided to ask all the residents of Buckden and Stirtloe what they think of the issue. In doing so, we will try to present key information with regards to various options for a 20 mph limit, costs, any additional traffic calming measures required etc. so that all residents may take an informed decision.

It is very important that the Parish Council hears that views of all residents. At the time of writing this article, the Parish Council is working on how your views will be captured. You will see a survey form on this page in the near future and we are also intending to enable electronic responses. Please take the time to respond to the survey when it is published so that we can make the right decision for our community.

Please keep watching this page for details and let your voice be heard.

## **Parking on pavements**

On a more mundane matter, our roads continue to be blighted by drivers who park on pavements. Whilst it is not illegal to park on a pavement, there must be sufficient space remaining for a wheel chair, buggy etc. to get past.

However, pavements aren't designed for the weight of vehicles and constant parking damages the pavements and makes them unsafe for pedestrians. The county council's budgets are now so stretched that there is very little funding for pavement repair.

So, please, park on the roads and ask your visitors, especially any workmen with vans or lorries, to do the same.

## **Walking around our parish**

You may have seen our new maps, showing interesting and informative routes for walkers. If you haven't got one (and they are really useful when you have visitors staying), you will find copies at the library. Shortly, you will see improvements in the signage around the extensive network of footpaths that we are lucky enough to have in our parish. We would, though, like to remind all residents that footpaths are for walkers, not for bikers or horse riders. Some of our footpaths have been quite badly damaged by being used as mountain bike or riding trails. Bike and horse riders, please stick to the official routes.

The next meeting of the **Parish Council, including a 15 minute Public Forum will be held on Tuesday 10th November 2015 starting at 7.30pm** in the Village Hall. Members of the public are welcome to attend and raise any Buckden related issues.

**FROM YOUR COUNTY COUNCILLOR  
E-CIGARETTES AND NEW TOBACCO LEGISLATION**

STOPTOBER is a national campaign encouraging smokers to give up tobacco for 28 days. Evidence shows that if a smoker can go this long without a cigarette, they are five times more likely to stay permanently smoke free. Nationally last year's campaign led by Public Health England saw 250,000 people take part and 65% of those who took part successfully quit for 28 days. The local stop smoking service CAMQUIT can support you to stop smoking whatever month it is!

E-cigarette update: A Public Health commissioned expert evidence review on e-cigarettes published on the 19<sup>th</sup> August 2015, has concluded that using current best estimates e-cigarettes are around 95% less harmful than traditional tobacco cigarettes, that nearly half the population (44.8%) don't realise e-cigarettes are much less harmful than smoking, and that there is no evidence so far that e-cigarettes are acting as a route into smoking for children and non-smokers.

From the 1<sup>st</sup> October 2015 the following tobacco control legislation will come into force in England and Wales: Smoking in cars: Smoking in private cars when children (under age 18) are present will be prohibited. Age of sale for nicotine products: it will be illegal to sell nicotine containing products, such as electronic cigarettes, to persons under the age of 18. Proxy purchasing for young people: it will become illegal for an adult to purchase any tobacco product or nicotine containing product (this will also include products such as e-cigarettes) on behalf of anyone under the age of 18.

Please be advised that residents can come along to the Buckden village hall on the second Tuesday of the month at 6.30pm for an hour to speak to me. I will be in the Aragon room and no appointment is necessary. My next surgery will be held on **Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> November 2015** and I look forward to meeting any resident who would like to come and speak to me.

**FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR  
Lower Speed Limit for Buckden**

I can understand why some residents would like to see the speed limit lowered for at least part of the village but I am always wary of 'Pressure Groups'. By their very nature such groups argue only one side of any argument. I am very happy to see that the Parish Council has agreed to set up a separate Working Group to examine all of the arguments for and against the proposals and to prepare a balanced summary for the Council to consider.

**A1 Improvements**

The contract for the strategic study on the future of the A1 has now been awarded and a representative of Highways England will provide an update to the A1 Safety Advisory Group which will meet on 20<sup>th</sup> October. I have now arranged to discuss the issues involved with our local MP on 6<sup>th</sup> November (the delay is due to my unavailability not his).

**Parking Problems at A1 end of Silver Street**

I have been made aware that cars have been parked in the turning area and that others have been parked along the left hand side of the road (coming from the A1) in such a way as to obstruct the free movement of traffic. The Parish Clerk and I are taking steps to have the turning area cleared of debris and overgrowth but I ask all local residents not to park in that space and to park with care along this potentially dangerous part of the road.

**ONE LEISURE**

Contrary to a recent report in the Hunts Post ONE LEISURE, which is responsible for all of the leisure facilities provided by HDC, is not run by a company but by the Council. Also contrary to reports these facilities will be run at a small surplus during the current financial year. If you have not taken advantage of the excellent facilities offered at all of our Sports Centres then I urge you to do so.

**Britain's Hoverflies—an introduction**

I don't know about you, but I just cannot imagine what it is like to leave everything, absolutely everything, get into a flimsy dinghy and sail through the night on Homer's 'wine dark sea'; or tramp for days and days carrying a toddler. I love living here in Buckden where I feel supported and cared for. I would be heartbroken if I were forced to leave this village, family and friends.

Can we, as a very caring village community see our way to support a family who have, indeed, left everything and risked everything to find a life free from fear? It is just an idea but one that I hope will be supported by you all – if each household in Buckden gave 50p a week (more or less as we each can afford) we could rent a house for a family from Syria and have enough left over to help them settle down, find work and bring up their children in peace. As I see it, there would be a giving and receiving on both sides engendering a sense of sharing, responsibility and belonging. As one family settles and hopefully moves on then another could be helped.

I do not have the skills or experience to drive this idea forward but I wonder if anyone reading this does? It would need careful planning and careful managing which will take quite a lot of time. It would also need the wholehearted and committed support of all of us. Please contact me (around 5 p.m. is a good time to catch me) if you feel you can help.

### Thought for the month

Perhaps surprisingly to some my training as a mathematician involved some study of philosophy. A philosopher once described the study of metaphysics as "searching in a darkened room for a black cat that is not there". There are those who would suggest that the same description applies to the search for God.

These are the folk who want scientific proof for the statements of the religion. They want archaeological evidence for the Flood; they want to know what species of whale swallowed Jonah; they want to know where and when Job lived.

Certainly the search for God sometimes feels like searching in a darkened room for a black cat, but any scientist will tell you that you cannot prove the cat is not there. Used properly, science is a wonderful thing. Applied inappropriately it is merely silly.

When science can prove the existence of love or distinguish between a collection of sounds and a piece of music it will be ready to join in the search for God. Until then it is simply the wrong tool for the job.

I believe that we are surrounded by signs of God's presence and involvement in this world, and of God's love for us. I further believe that God has built in, as part of our design specification as it were, the equipment we need to detect these signs and to interpret their significance.

However, humanity is imperfect. In our state of separation from God we find that this in-built detection equipment is a bit wonky. We fail to spot the signs of God's love around us.

Thankfully, God has also given us tools to help us recover our sign-spotting abilities. We have the Bible. We have the experiences of those who have held the faith before us. We have our intellect and our reason. All these and more are needed if we are to refine our senses enough to see and understand what God is trying to tell us — that God loves us.







### Flo Coomber's

Opposite The Green, Flo Coomber's was the first in a terrace of three cottages. Weather permitting and during an absence of customers, Flo could be found outside, leaning against the cheek of her boundary wall (*only recently removed*), calling out to passers-by and shouting details of her best buys to youngsters.... "Plums today. Tell your Mum!" That wall was particularly helpful to Flo because she only had one good leg; the other ended in a stump and was cocooned in a motley selection of bandages.

Beside her front door were crates containing salad items, vegetables and orchard fruit, even walnuts. 'Serve yourself!' The produce was mostly of local origin and today would've probably been marketed as 'organic!' 'Open all hours', it was only Louis Seaman's visit, cycling up from Offord to undertake the annual stock-take (on a Sunday), that interrupted business.

Flo ran her shop from her front room. Enter the doorway and turn sharp left or you would find yourself in a painful encounter with her chiffonier. Pan around the room and see the couch, where the dog slumbered. It was black, and could've been mistaken for a rag-rug! (Rumour had it that dog was none too particular where it cocked its leg!). Take in the haphazard display of boxed chocolates, tins of biscuits, bottles of Corona and Tizer. Centre stage was a colourful selection of sweets, behind which Flo, encased in her 'wraparound pinny', seated herself, utilising the light from the adjacent window in order to oversee business.

With her selection of sweets, many sold in multiples to the penny (*that's 1d!*), Flo's was popular with village kids. This was in spite of quite widespread parental opposition, the reasons for which, as youngsters, we were largely impervious to; while proximity to the school simply served to amplify the shop's magnetism. These were days when children made their own way to and from school and so were free of helicopter parents, who might otherwise scupper any purchasing plans.


Business was further bolstered by her Christmas club. Contributors could set aside 6d or more weekly, from summer onwards, with a view to saving-up for a bit of a splurge on some of Flo's specials at Christmas..... jigsaws, board games, a tin of Tartan shortbread or Bluebird toffees.

Flo was a habitual smoker, with each fag glued to her lips until the final embers dropped into her lap. The open fire augmented the smoky haze. These being days many decades before the advent of Dettol and the like, hygiene was not a high priority. There was a token fly-paper suspended from the ceiling, but this was invariably encrusted with a lace-like layer of wings and legs – *not nice!* Flo's hands had more the look of the farm labourer than of someone handling edibles. The many sweets....liquorice sticks and Catherine Wheels, chocolate tools and Flying Saucers, that were free of a protective wrapper, faced prolonged exposure to the ambient dust and smoke as well as to the intermittent exhalations of Flo's hacking cough! Perhaps worse, as you deliberated over your choice of sweets, they would each in turn be swept up into Flo's bare hands. It was not until your selection was completed that those sweets, finally, reached the safety of a small paper bag. **AMB**

### NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH (NHW) SHED SECURITY

Many people underestimate the value of the items they store in their sheds. Unfortunately, criminals are fully aware of the value of the goods that some people store in vulnerable places. Help to keep your property secure and reduce the chance of you becoming a victim of crime by painting your house number and post-code onto your valuable gardening equipment (e.g. lawnmower, strimmer, and tools). This makes them much less attractive to potential thieves as it makes them more difficult to sell on. It also increases the chances of the property being recovered and returned to its rightful owner after it has been stolen.

### LOCKS and BOLTS

The most effective way to secure shed doors is to fit a strong hasp and staple (also called a 'pad bar'). Secure this with coach bolts (long bolts with a smooth head that cannot be undone with a screwdriver or spanner) and lock the hasp over the staple with a closed, shackled padlock. You can further protect your shed with items such as 'shed bars' and larger items such as cycles can be secured to shed shackles. These and other approved products can be found at [www.soldsecure.co.uk](http://www.soldsecure.co.uk) or [www.securedbydesign.com](http://www.securedbydesign.com) Secure the shed door hinges with 'clutch head' or 'coffin' screws. These are a special type of screw that once fitted can only be unscrewed with a special tool. They can be purchased from DIY outlets and on the internet.


