# Buckden Parish Council News



#### Roads again dominate our page this month.

#### Firstly, the A14

As many of you will be aware, on the 11<sup>th</sup> of May the Secretary of State announced the decision to go ahead with the construction of the new A14.

One of the first developments in the Buckden area will be the building of a construction compound, which will be situated immediately to the north of the Buckden to Brampton road, with access some distance past the A1 bridge when travelling from Buckden. The latest plans show parking for approximately 460 vehicles which is an indication of the anticipated scale of activity at the site.

The first major work on the A14 scheme will actually be on the A1 between Brampton Hut and Alconbury. This will involve the widening of this section of the A1 from 4 lanes to 6. This work is due to start in October/November of this year and continue to mid-2018, involving night closures and diversions at times.

The main construction work on the new A14 from Brampton Hut, passing Buckden to the north and on to Cambridge, is not expected to start until 2017.

There will be public information exhibitions on: Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> September at Offord Village Hall from 2pm – 8pm and Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> October at Brampton Memorial Centre from 10am – 4pm. #### Secondly, 20 mph limit in Buckden

Plans are now in place with Cambridgeshire County Council to introduce a 20 mph area around Buckden School and Nursery. All planning has been made in consultation with road safety experts from CCC.

The 20 mph area will include Church St from just before South's Almshouses to the chicane at Mill Rd, including the Hunts End triangle and The Barns. It will begin in Silver St with a traffic calming measure near where the stream goes under the road and include all Silver St up to Church St, all School Lane, all Bishops' Way, all Greenway and the various roads off Greenway. The 30 mph limit will be extended for 100 metres east of the village leading up to the Mill Rd chicane.

If you would like to see a map of the area covered, please visit the Clerk's office in the Village Hall. We hope that these changes will take place during the autumn.

#### Handymen

You might see a new face about the village carrying out handyman duties. This is Bob Mann who will be replacing Clive Bullimore who leaves shortly. Many thanks to Clive for all his hard work. We think that all will agree that, together with Martin Craddock, our handymen keep our village looking very clean and tidy.

#### Trees and Hedges

Trees and hedges may now be safely trimmed back without the danger of disturbing birds' nests. Could we please ask that all house owners check that their trees and hedges are not over-hanging or obstructing pavements, footpaths and alleyways.

The annual meeting of the Parish Council, including a 15 minute Public Forum will be held on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> September 2016 starting at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. Members of the public are welcome to attend and raise any Buckden related issues.

If required, the Parish Council's Planning Committee will meet on Tuesday 13th and Tuesday 27th September starting 7pm. Agendas for the meetings are posted on the Parish Council notice boards not later than the Saturday preceding the meeting

#### A14

Residents may have noticed preliminary work to the left of the road to Brampton. Construction work will start on the widening of the A1 between Alconbury and Brampton Hut early in the new year.

#### **A1**

The Buckden roundabout continues to be the bane of our lives and I fear that there is very little that can be done except to persuade drivers approaching it on the A1 to drive more slowly. I am currently trying to find a way to have a filter onto the roundabout from Perry Road similar to that at the south end of High Street. Hopefully we shall soon have some idea of what the proposed new route of the A1 may look like but there is little hope of a new road until at the earliest 2025 – I hope to be around to see it!

#### There's a new number to call if you have a power cut

When the power goes out, it can leave people feeling unsure about what to do. Research by Energy Networks Association found that 72% of people don't know who to contact during a power cut, with many wrongly thinking they should call the electricity supplier they pay their bill to.



105 aims to solve this problem, providing you with an easy-to-remember number that will put you through to your local electricity network operator - the company that manages the cables, wires and substations that bring electricity into local homes and businesses.

In England, Scotland and Wales, there are six Distribution Network Operators (DNOs) that operate in different geographical regions and several Independent Distribution Network Operators (IDNOs) that operate across regions. DNOs and IDNOs are each responsible for ensuring that homes and businesses have electricity 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

105 is just one of the ways you can contact your network operator. They can still be contacted directly by phone on their 0800 number or via their website – and most can be reached through social media too.

105 is a free service for people in England, Scotland and Wales, and you can call the number from most landlines and mobile phones. It doesn't matter who you choose to buy your electricity from - anyone can call 105.

You can also call 105 if you spot damage to electricity power lines and substations that could put you, or someone else, in danger. If there's a serious immediate risk, call the emergency services too.

#### The Children's Society in 2016

In the late nineteenth century, Edward Rudolf, a young Sunday school teacher and civil servant in South London, found himself confronted by the brutal effects of poverty on the lives of children.



When two young boys failed to turn up for his Sunday school, he went to look for them and was shocked to find them begging for food on the streets. Their father had died, leav-

ing their mother struggling to bring up seven children under 11 years old. Theirs was not an isolated experience and Rudolf was moved to act. By 1919, Rudolf had established the Children's Society at the forefront of providing services to vulnerable children.

#### Not much has changed.

Not a week goes by where there is not a story of child neglect, poverty, injustice or child sexual exploitation. The Hard Truth is that over 3.7 million children currently live in poverty across the UK. In 2016, 70,000 children will run away from home or care, and 1 in 13 will self-harm by the age of 16. 219,000 children across the East of England have been categorised as children in need. Get involved and help us change the world for children. We have a number of exciting volunteer roles, which means you can give as much, or as little time as you feel is appropriate.

**Fundraising volunteers** are urgently required to organise their own events, from cake baking to coffee mornings. Just £20.00 raised will be enough for one of our Project Workers to give immediate support to a neglected or abused child.

**Fundraising Support Groups** are required: 4 to 6 like-minded people can form a group, bring their community closer together, whilst raising more for a good cause.

**Volunteer Speakers are needed:** To talk about the work of the Children's Society in schools, businesses and churches, promoting our vision, values and support for vulnerable children.

**Box Co-ordinators across the Diocese of Ely are needed.** Start a house box network through your church or community, collect the loose change once a year and donate to the Children's Society. It's simple and fun. No experience is required for any of these roles: you will however need some drive and tenacity. Full training, resources and materials will be provided.



HDC Refuse Permission for the proposed development of 180 houses off Lucks Lane, Buckden

Firstly, a big thank you to the 221 Buckden and local residents who have taken the time to write to HDC objecting to this planned development; your voices were heard! Several objecting authorities, including HDC, Cambs County Council and Highways England, preferred the public's detailed local knowledge to the developer's sweeping statements. By comparison, a similar development on the outskirts of Brampton had 12 objecting letters, little opposition from other authorities and was recently approved.

On 15th August 2016, Hunts District Council refused planning permission for the proposed plan to build 180 houses off Lucks Lane. Their detailed letter is available on their planning website (Ref: 16/00576/OUT, Documents, Page 4, Decision Notice dated 15/8/2016).

In summary, their reasons for refusal were that the plans were unsustainable within the meaning of the National Planning Policy Framework, based on the significant environmental harm that would be caused by the proposed development, including:

- the erosion of the rural character gap between Buckden & Stirtloe
- the illustrative layout proposed cramped, over-intensive housing of insufficiently high quality which failed to integrate into the rural landscape
- the possible destruction of archaeology
- the anticipated increase in outbound vehicle trips from the development via Stirtloe Lane onto the A1 making it 'extremely likely' that collisions of 'serious harm' would result
- the developers were unable to demonstrate that the traffic impact of the proposed development on local highways, within and around Buckden, would not be severe
- possible flooding risk from Grafham Water
- the refusal should be considered in the context of the HDC's being able to demonstrate a 5 year housing plan (including 5% buffer) without reliance on this proposal. And even if the HDC were not able to demonstrate this, any benefits of the proposal would still be outweighed when assessed against the NPPF policies overall.

This is good news for all those wanting to protect Buckden from unwanted expansion into the surrounding countryside, a massive increase in population and excessive traffic. BUT, it is likely that the developer will appeal the HDC's refusal within the next six months or will submit amended plans for a smaller development, so we must remain diligent. The Protect Buckden Committee will continue to monitor the situation and will keep you updated.

Thank you for your time and interest, this matter still concerns everyone in Buckden and in all Huntingdonshire villages (because it would set a precedent for unopposable expansion of all villages). 
